When the sea loses energy, it drops the sand, rocks and pebbles it has been carrying.

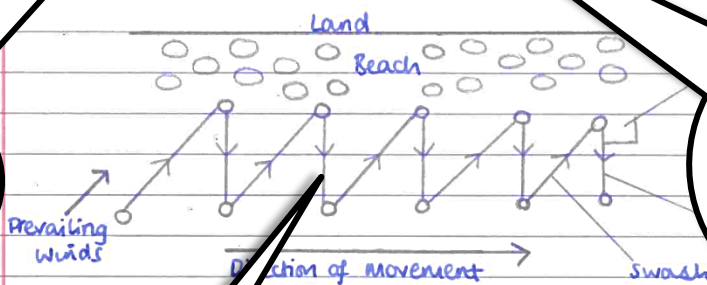
How and why do constructive waves build up beaches?
